When this has been completed we will seek quotations for 'blanket-cover' insurance. If this should prove prohibitively expensive we will rely on them being covered by the winner's own household insurance and will supply a copy of the Insurance Valuation to all future recipients. Obviously, for everyone's peace of mind I hope the Society will be able to cover the Insurance Premium out of funds and, in this respect, the current Credit Balance, on first sight somewhat more than is required for the normal running of the society, should be sufficient to cover this item.

And so we now look forward to our Golden Jubilee celebrations. The enclosed fixture list shows the happy news that all 4 meetings in 1984 will be sponsored. Sponsorship is 'good news' to members. It brings bigger and better prizes, helps keep costs down, provides much appreciated little gifts and ensures the dining table is amply endowed with wine. In return, for a relatively modest outlay, our generous sponsors receive a return in the form of a lot of goodwill amongst customers (and competitors) and have an opportunity to invite their own special clients for a rewarding and entertaining day's golf and hospitality. I am sure all members will join with me in wishing our benefactors success and give them every support.

In conclusion, I take this opportunity to thank our retiring Captain, John Young, for his endeavours during the past year. We have always been fortunate in electing very able captains who, in their different ways, have contributed much to the enjoyment and success of our meetings. John has fully upheld these traditions and I am very pleased that 1983 was such a great success for him and for us. Our best wishes are extended to his successor, Lionel Scott, for the coming, and we hope momentous, year ahead.

David Morgan and myself have greatly enjoyed the past year, and I hope you did too.
